Form EP-9 Waste Profile and Form EP-10 Waste Manifest

Forms EP-9 and EP-10 are created by the Railroad Commission (RRC). These forms are optional and do not need to be submitted to the RRC unless specifically requested. All involved entities must keep manifest records for at least three years, or longer if operational permits require.

Operators can use electronic formats or alternative forms if they contain the necessary information. Additionally, the profile and manifest can be combined into a single document, provided all required information from both is included in the record.

Alternative forms or formats must include the following information:

- 1. Generator's name, RRC operator number, and site address or latitude/longitude.
- 2. Transporter's name and waste hauler permit number.
- 3. Type of waste, volume, and associated handling codes.
- 4. Name and physical location of the receiving facility.
- 5. Dates of shipment, receipt, and final disposition.

Form EP-9 is intended to gather important information from oil & gas operators about their facilities and operational sites.

This form serves several purposes, including:

- Permit reviews
- Regulatory inspections
- Reporting on operational status

It also ensures that each waste stream is accurately classified for proper handling and treatment.

Form EP-10 documents the transportation of regulated waste, including produced water, drilling mud, and cuttings, from the point of generation to authorized treatment or disposal facilities.

This form serves several important purposes:

- It enables proper tracking of the load
- It ensures compliance with regulations
- It allows for verification by all parties involved
